ENGLISH

MATHEMATICS

Units of work from Devon's guidance on: number sense, additive reasoning, multiplicative reasoning and geometric reasoning.

SCIENCE

A unit of work on Properties and Changes of Materials to include: comparing and grouping materials on the basis of properties and uses; introducing reversible and non-reversible changes and formation of new materials and the materials used in Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age.

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HISTORY

Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age: The development from hunter-gatherers to farmers, new technology and tribal kingdoms; understanding that Prehistoric Britain was the time between the first humans and the arrival of the Romans and that it was a time before written records; continuing to develop chronology and note connections and contrasts over time; the appropriate use of historical terms; selecting and organising relevant historical information; studying shelters and homes, food and technology.

ART and DESIGN

Creating cave paintings with mixed mediums.

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6- **Computational Thinking-** How do we think about problems so that computers can help? A unit of work focussing on using logical reasoning, algorithms, decomposition, abstraction, patterns and evaluation to tackle a problem.
