Class 1 - Mrs Betts

In drawing club this week, the children were using '*The Magic Porridge Pot*' as the inspiration for their stories.

The children have finished their maths unit on Place Value within 20 and have just begun Addition and Subtraction within 20. In reception, the children have been comparing objects and size using the language taller, tallest, fewer, most, more and equal to.

Mrs Mclean joined us on Monday to teach a music lesson. The children had great fun learning about keeping in time, using Colonel Hathi's March from the *Jungle Book*. They identified and had a go at singing in pitch. As well as, playing percussion instruments including the boomwhackers.

We had a wonderful whole-school Mexican Culture Day on Tuesday, and it was lovely to see the children dressed in red and green, in keeping with the Mexican flag. The children had a go at making Mexican flowers, decorating chillies, food tasting, football games and penalty shoot-out and making and playing piñata's.

Class 2- Ms Rae

Tuesday was our cultural day focusing on all things Mexican. This included decorating chillies, tasting different Mexican foods and making a Mexican cake, making and playing maracas, having a penalty shoot out, making Mexican God's eyes and finally making and then playing with a pinata. The children really enjoyed working with Class 1 and it was lovely to see all of the relationships develop during the day.

In English, after working hard on the beginning, middle and end of their chapter to go with *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang* and *The Race Against Time* they worked hard on editing their work, focusing on the language they were using and ensuring each section had smooth transitions, before finally producing their final version whilst considering illustrations and their placement. Some fantastic chapters have been created.

In maths both Year 3 and 4 and Year 5 and 6 have started looking at addition and subtraction this week and developing the skills they have learnt during their previous learning.

We continued our work in Geography, with the focus this week on Europe and the seas connected to European countries with everyone learning about small countries they had previously never heard of.

And Art saw Year 3 and 4 creating more abstract styles of self portraits whilst Year 5 and 6 worked on improving their clay tiles ready for printing and understanding how some features may not work as they originally anticipated.

Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Are you entitled?

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
