Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

It has been a fantastic first week back to school and it has been wonderful to see the children thoroughly enjoying their balance ability sessions this week.

This term we are introducing 'Drawing Club' to our timetable. The children have thoroughly embraced this and have loved listening to our story 'We're going on a bear hunt,' and devising their own characters and storylines.

Each week we learn a selection of new words linked to the story along with actions. I wonder if you can remember the actions to go alongside our words this week Owls?: obstacle, joyful, capture, wade, flee, courageous and gloomy.

Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year One have eased back into our daily routine well this week and all enjoyed the excitement of Wednesday's snow!

We have been reading *The Train Ride* by June Crebbin as part of our English learning. Our Curious Quest is proving very exciting and we have been thinking about the use of verbs in our sentences. We know that changing the verb creates a completely different sentence.



In Maths we have begun a new sequence on place value and we will be working with numbers to 20. This week we have been trying to ensure that we record the numbers 12-19 correctly, making sure we write the digits in the correct order. There has been some discussion about what each digit represents and how 15 and 51 are two very different numbers!

In Geography we began learning about Sri Lanka. We had a presentation sent to us from Poppy, a former Winkleigh Primary School student. Poppy shared photos of her recent turtle conservation work in Sri Lanka and we all found this really interesting.



In Art we are learning about Piet Mondrian and his abstract artwork. We will be creating our own artwork in the coming weeks as well as experimenting with colour mixing.

Year 2—Mr Slocombe

It has been lovely to welcome Year 2 back to school this week and hear all about their exciting Christmas breaks!

English has seen us begin our new sequence all about space! We have loved learning lots of facts about our universe and beyond!

In maths, we have finished our sequence about shape before moving on and beginning to learn about multiplication and division.

The absolute highlight has got to be our trip to Plymouth this week, despite the questionable weather at times! We were disappointed not to be able to go on Wednesday but spent the day instead learning about the aquarium and watching an alternative pantomime. Finally this afternoon we managed to make it to the theatre and watch the production of Snow White! It was a great experience and we enjoyed watching the performance and special effects! In Maths, we have been practicing the formal method of multiplication and have been following a series of steps to solve a range of different problems.


We have been busy starting our sequences and in Geography, we have been learning about the water cycle and explaining it to our partners.

In Art, we have started to look at the artist William Morris and the types of art work he was famous for, the children started to create their own unique pattern in the same style.

Year 6—Miss McLean

Year Six have started the term with a brilliant attitude towards their learning and have enjoyed starting all of our new sequences.

In English, we are looking at the book *The Everyday Journeys of Ordinary Things* by Libby Deutsch. We have explored the layout of the pages and taken some time to get to know the journeys of cocoa beans and recycled glass. We have also begun looking at different ways to expand noun phrases.

In maths, we have begun a sequence on decimals and percentages. The children have recalled prior knowledge about decimals and have been working with the place value of decimals as well as rounding them.

We have also started all of our new sequences in the foundation subjects: Living things and their habitats in science, South America in geography, web design in computing, keeping safe in PSHE and learning about LS Lowry in art.

| Chickenpox | at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over |

| Diarrhoea and Vomiting | 48 hours after their last episode |
| Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19) | they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19 |
| Impetigo | their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics |
| Measles | 4 days after the rash first appeared |
| Mumps | 5 days after the swelling started |
| Scabies | they've had their first treatment |
| Scarlet Fever | 24 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
| Whooping Cough | 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics |

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
