Dear Parents and Carers,

Children have been working hard this week, as always. There has been some fantastic work going on throughout the school. Every day children have a morning task or track time, on Fridays we have book club where all children complete a book related activity. This term we have introduced 'Art Club' as one of our morning tasks where the whole school looks at the same piece of art and completes an activity about it. We then have an assembly each week to share thoughts and ideas. So far, the children have looked at various paintings, such as *Wheatfields with Cypresses* by Van Gogh, *The Waiting Place* by Gainsborough and *The Drawbridge* by Jacob Morris.

## Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

There has been a flurry of activity in Owls Class this week and the children have now really settled into the routines of school life.

In phonics we have learnt the phonic sounds associated with the following graphemes: i,n,m and d, and it has been wonderful to watch the children writing them everywhere as well as constantly thinking about objects and items that begin with these phonic sounds.

They were all very excited to share a book during guided reading time this week and loved playing 'I spy' games and talking about the pictures. We hope they have enjoyed sharing their wordless books with you at home during the week. We always start our reading journey with books containing just pictures as a way of encouraging the children to enjoy books without the pressure of words. Please enjoy looking at the pictures together, making up stories and playing 'I spy' using the pictures. Don't forget to write in your child's reading record book when you do share a book at home, and please leave these open in your child's message wallets so that we can see they have read and can reward them with well deserved stickers! These books will be changed every Tuesday so please ensure they are in your child's book bag on a Tuesday ready to be renewed.

In maths this week the children have loved listening to a range of stories all about buttons! They have sorted buttons, counted buttons and looked very carefully at the shapes, colours and sizes of buttons! ***I wonder how many different types of buttons you can find at home this weekend Owls?***

As part of our RE topic the children learnt all about Christian Baptisms on Monday and loved baptising their own babies, making special cards and setting up celebration tea parties for them too. We are hoping to visit the church in a few weeks time to see where a baptism might take place in our local church.

Our art topic this term is weaving and threading and the children have had a great time this week threading pasta necklaces and weaving spiders web linked to a range of spider related songs and stories!

We are very much looking forward to a visit from our local PSCO who is going to talk about her job in helping people.

We would love it if the children could bring in a photograph of either someone who is special to them, or who they go to if they need help or need a hug!

## Year 1— Mrs Keast

This week we have enjoyed two trips out in Year One. We went to Winkleigh Church on Wednesday afternoon and learned all about the different artefacts and features. On Thursday we spent the day at Rosemoor and created some brilliant pieces of outdoor artwork.



In English this week we have been reading the story Rapunzel and we have created our own hero, our own tower and thought about where Rapunzel would go on her honeymoon!

In Maths we have gained more knowledge of numbers to 10, counting on from a given number. We played a fun dice game in pairs to help apply our counting skills.

In Geography we looked at Google Earth and explored our journeys to school. We learned about maps and how they use a compass and a key. Next week we will be thinking about our home address and begin creating a postcard home. Please can the children each bring in a stamp to school next week so that we can visit the Post Office the following week and post our postcards home.



## Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Wow! Year 2 continue to shine and thrive! In English, we have been working together to co-create our own version of the focus story - No-bot: The robot with no bottom! We've built our writing up over the week, adding a paragraph each day, using No-bot as a basis but making changes.

Maths has seen us comparing objects and numbers. On Monday, we used balance scales to compare a range of resources, recording sentences using  $<$   $>$   $=$ . We have been sequencing and ordering numbers towards the end of the week, before learning about counting in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10! ***I wonder if you can practise this at home?***

We have been busy in science, learning about and identifying different habitats. We walked around the school grounds, noticing the variety of habitats that we could find.

Geography involved learning more Antarctica and its features.

## Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

Year 3s have had another great week. They have continued with *The Lord of the Forest*, looking at interesting verbs, noun phrases, prepositional phrases and planning out the *Lord of the Ocean* story.

They have finished their place value maths and will be moving on to Addition and Subtraction. Any counting opportunities at home, please do encourage the children, counting on and back over boundaries is always a bit tricky and the best bits to go over, 98, 99, 100, 101 or 303, 302, 301, 309, 299, 298.

In RE children have compared the Theory of the Big Bang with the Christians theory of the creation of the Earth, this proved a very interesting conversation.

In Science they looked at how important Many Anning's discoveries were and the legacy of them. Children are making excellent links between the science, RE and geography topics, and love learning about our planet.

Thank you also, for all the encouragement getting the children to read and record it in their books. They are really enjoying choosing new books from the book corner, they really feel a sense of independence choosing their own reading material.

A huge thank you for everyone who is sending in fruit snacks. The children really do get hungry as they have done a morning task, and 2 lessons by break and then there is another 2 lessons before lunch!

Thank you for all the encouragement getting the children to read and record it in their books. They are really enjoying choosing new books from the book corner, they really feel a sense of independence choosing their own reading material.

Finally, to clarify, we are spelling testing on Mondays and Fridays using the same words, but by Friday they have had 5 spelling lessons and there has been significant improvements between the 2 tests.

## Year 4—Mr Walter

This week, Year 4 have been working really hard on their English writing. We have taken our understanding of The Great Kapok Tree further by using adverbials and expanded noun phrases to enhance the language we were using within our writing. We have then worked on planning a persuasive letter using six different persuasive devices to persuade the character to not chop down trees. This has had cross-curricular links with our geography sequence on rainforests where we discussed and drew our understanding of the different layers. Detailing the differences between the forest floor and the emergent layer. **We are looking forward to learning more about this at the Eden Project next week.**

In maths, we have come to the end of our place value sequence looking at the ways we round to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand. We used number lines alongside our rhyme to remember which digits we are rounding up and down. **Remember that 0-4 drop to the floor, 5-9 climb the vine.** Next week, we will focus on addition and subtraction as our new learning sequence. Well done to our TTRS certificate winners this week, every Wednesday we will now have an assembly to celebrate different achievements across Key Stage 2.

In science we experimented the presence of gases. We discussed how an empty bottle could be squashed with the lid on and off whilst investigating what happens when a sponge is submerged underwater. This allowed us to identify how gas escapes and rises through air bubbles. There were lots of surprised faces this week for art club. Our featured artwork was focussing on still life showing fruit and flowers, so we had a go at drawing our own examples using objects found around the school that were arranged on our tables.

A polite reminder, we do try and get outside everyday for break, lunch and track when the weather allows. If every child has a coat in school it makes it easier for us to maximise the opportunities when possible, thank you.

## Year 5— Mr Saltearn

This week Year 5 have been practicing their skills in Tag rugby. We have been focusing on our passing accuracy and practicing our skills into games.

In English, we have been using parentheses to add extra information to our sentences and we have also been focusing on writing in the third person and extending our sentences to create a multi clause sentence.

In Maths, we have started our new sequence on addition and subtraction, we have been focusing on adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers using column methods. We have spotted mistakes in our methods and by using our reasoning skills to explain what the mistakes are we then correct them.

In geography, we have continued our learning about mountains and we have created facts about each of the 5 types of mountains with examples of real mountains.

In Science, the children learnt about the difference between melting and dissolving, they then got into groups to designed an experiment to test what materials would melt or dissolve. We look forward to seeing the results when we do the experiment next week.

## Year 6—Miss McLean

Year Six have shown a lot of resilience this week in our maths learning based on prime, square and cubed numbers. They have worked collaboratively on problem solving tasks, sharing ideas and reasoning. We have started looking at methods to multiply 4-digit and 2-digit numbers together beginning with using a column.

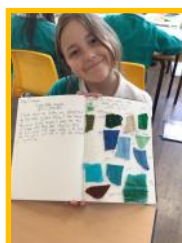
In English, we have continued using Beowulf as our core text to gain information about grammar and punctuation features. We looked at the use of semicolons to join two main clauses together rather than using a conjunction. We also looked at the use of hyphens in expanded noun phrases.

In science this week, we discuss how shadows are formed and what variables may change the size and shape of a shadow. We also learnt about how a solar eclipse is a shadow of the moon being cast onto the earth.

We looked at grid references on maps in geography and had a go at locating places on an OS map using grid references and looking at the OS symbols.

Finally, in art this week, we started to make our fabric collages based on a piece of art. The children have all chosen something from an artist that they have learnt about during their time at Winkleigh and are recreating a part of it in fabric. They are using their stitching skills to join pieces together.

## Yes

### Until...

Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
