Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

Owls Class have continued with their arachnid theme this week as part of art, and have been working on the fine motor skills by creating spiders for the webs they made last week.

They enjoyed a walk around the school grounds on Tuesday in search of some spiders, looking for webs and at the size and colour of the spiders.

In maths we have moved on to looking at numbers and have worked on recognising representations of 1,2 and 3, counting up to 3 objects carefully, subitising, playing games and learning to recognise the numerals.

The children are continuing to enjoy their phonics lessons, and this week have learnt the phonemes made by the following graphemes: 'g, o, c and k.' They have also learnt their first 'tricky word' and have been looking out for the word 'is' around the classroom and in books.

The children had a fantastic PSED day on Thursday, learning all about plastics in the oceans as well as finding out all about the role of a local PSCO police officer.

The children are very much looking forward to our trip to Bear Town next week where it will be our first opportunity to mix with, and meet the children from Class One at Kings Nympton school.

Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year One thoroughly enjoyed our PSHE Day on Thursday. We began the day with an assembly delivered by Libby Bowles from Plastic Free Devon. We learned about the impact of plastics on sealife and how we can help by buying fewer single use plastic items. Mrs Roberts then taught us how to make some lovely sea scenes using recycled eggboxes. To end the day, we had an assembly with Sandra Brown, PCSO. Sandra told us about her job role and how she helps to support the local community.

In English this week we loved watching Button Moon and creating our own planets, characters and learning some interesting new vocabulary including the words splutter, telescope and journey.

Thank you to everyone who has already sent in a stamp for our Geography posting activity next week - we are hoping to post some postcards home from the post-box at Winkleigh Post Office.







Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have been writing their own versions of No-bot: The Robot with no bottom this week! We have had some fantastic versions of the story with all sorts of body parts going missing!

Maths has seen us work on addition and subtraction this week, focusing on number bonds to 10 and within 20.

Meanwhile, in science, we learnt about microhabitats, taking our learning from last week and building on it to learn about smaller environments.

In geography, we found out more about hot deserts, comparing them to what we already know about cold deserts. We discovered more about the adaptations that some animals and plants make in order to survive in these areas.

We had a fantastic day yesterday, focusing on PSHE. We learnt about our role as global citizens and thought about what we could do to reduce the amount of plastic pollution.

We enjoyed a visit from Libby to discuss sea plastics, as well as PCSO Sandra who talked about her role.

Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

In English year 3s have written the Lord of the Ocean story, and will finish the sequence with Lord of the.... They have had some great ideas!

In maths we have been visually representing adding and taking 2 digit numbers ending in 0 from a 3 digit number. This exchange of counters is really making sense to children, seeing it visually is really supporting the children.

For PHSE Day the children have been thinking about why they are grateful and they all made an individual piece to go on the class totem to show their unity.











Year 4—Mr Walter

Year 4 enjoyed their trip to the Eden Project on Wednesday this week. We became rainforest rangers by undertaking training of how we could survive in the rainforest whilst exploring the domes to see the different plants that we could use for shelter, food and drink. It was a highlight for everyone as we reached the canopy to see the waterfall and cross the wobbly bridge.

In English, we have started our sequence focussing on poetry. Discovering the different poems Roger McGough has compiled in the book *Poetry Pie*.

Whilst in maths, we have consolidated our prior understanding of methods to add and subtract.

In science, we conducted an experiment into the way ice cubes melt in different temperatures.

Finally, on Thursday we had a PSHE day. Our focus in class was on decision making and the consequences that could happen from this, linking with our classroom environment but also following on from our assembly based on plastics in the ocean.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

This week Year 5 have completed their sequence in English, using the book *Great* adventurers and have created their own double page recap of the adventure that Michael Collins and the other members of Appollo 11 took.

In Maths, we have continued our sequence on addition and subtraction and have been using the inverse to check answers and finding missing numbers in different sums. We have used RUCSAC to help us solve multi step problems.

In Science, the children carried out their experiment that they designed last week to test what materials dissolved and which melted. We also recapped the difference between these two terms.

In PE, we have been practicing our dribbling skills in basketball and using a range of passes to beat a defender.

Year 6—Miss McLean

Year Six have worked on some shared writing in English this week, using Beowulf as inspiration. We have written a story about a polluting monster with a similar plot to Beowulf and using some of the grammar features used by the author Kevin Crossley.

In maths, we have looked at three different methods of multiplication. The children have worked up from multiplying 2-digit by 2-digit numbers to 4-digits by 2-digits. Next week, we will move on to the methods of short and long division.


In science, the children worked together to plan an experiment to explore how the distance of a light source from an object impacts the shadow that is created. We will have a go at this on Monday next week.

On Thursday, we joined the whole school in our PSHE day where we discussed the importance of refusing single use plastic. The children have all made a poster to take home and choose somewhere to display it around our local area.

Finally, the children also wrote a letter to themselves to open at the end of Year Six.



All Sorts

All Sorts After School Club runs from 3.30pm to 5.30pm every day. You may book regular or ad-hoc sessions, whichever suits your requirements. You may book sessions for one hour for £5.30 (3.30pm - 4.30pm or 4.30pm - 5.00pm / 4.30pm - 5.30pm when booked in conjunction with an Enrichment Club), two hours for £10.60 (3.30pm-5.30pm).

Reporting Absences

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Are you entitled?

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
